Canterbury City Council is inviting representations on the Draft Charging Schedule between Friday 22 February and Friday 5 April 2019. The Draft Charging Schedule sets out the proposed Community Infrastructure Levy charging rates for development within Canterbury District. A Draft Instalments and Payment in Kind Policy is also published for consultation.

- The publication of the recommendations of the examiner and reasons for those and;
- The approval of the charging schedule by Canterbury City Council.

All representations must be received by 17.00 on Friday 5 April 2019. Late representations cannot be considered.

Following the close of the consultation all representations will be submitted to a Planning Inspector as part of the independent examination of the Draft Charging Schedule.
