

**THE KENT COUNTY COUNCIL (VARIOUS ROADS, CITY OF CANTERBURY) (PROHIBITION OF STOPPING ON FOOTWAY OR VERGE) (AMENDMENT NO 1) ORDER 2019**

Notice is hereby given that the KENT COUNTY COUNCIL has made the above Order under sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3), 3(2), 4(1) and (2), 32(1), 35(1), 45, 46, 49 and 53 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act:

The effect of the Order is to amend The Kent County Council (Various Roads, City Of Canterbury) (Prohibition Of Stopping On Footway Or Verge) (Consolidation) Order 2018 by introducing new or varying existing parking and waiting restrictions on the following lengths of road in the Canterbury district:

London Road	Canterbury	On the whole of the grassed area bounded by Queens Avenue, Rheims Way and London Road
Queens Avenue	Canterbury	On the whole of the grassed area bounded by Queens Avenue, Rheims Way and London Road
Rheims Way	Canterbury	On the whole of the grassed area bounded by Queens Avenue, Rheims Way and London Road
St George's Street	Canterbury	On both sides from points in line with the south-eastern flank wall of 23 St George's Street to the junction with Lower Bridge Street
Sea Street	Herne Bay	On both sides between Fitzgerald Avenue and Hampton Pier Avenue
Tyler Hill Road	Blean	On both sides between the junctions with Blean Common and School Lane

The order was made on 15 March 2019 and comes into force on 15 March 2019. Full details are contained in the Order which, together with a statement of the council's reasons for making the Order and a copy of the orders amended by the Order, may be examined at the Canterbury City Council offices, Military Road, Canterbury, CT1 1YW during normal office hours.

Any person wishing to question the validity of the Order or any of the provisions contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the relevant enabling Act or that any requirement of any such enabling Act or of any regulations made thereunder have not been complied with may within six weeks from the date on which the Order was made make application to the High Court for this purpose.
