

**THE KENT COUNTY COUNCIL (CANTERBURY) (TRAFFIC REGULATION AND STREET PARKING PLACES) (AMENDMENT NO 4) ORDER 2018**

Notice is hereby given that KENT COUNTY COUNCIL propose to make the above Order under sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3), 3(2), 4(1) and (2), 32(1), 35(1), 45, 46, 49 and 53 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act.

The effect of the Order is to amend the Kent County Council (Canterbury) (Traffic Regulation and Street Parking Places) (Consolidation) Order 2017 by introducing new or varying existing parking and waiting restrictions on the following lengths of road in Canterbury:

Nunnery Road, Norman Road, Nunnery Fields (between the railway bridge and South Canterbury Road), Martindale Close	Make the residents' parking bays subject to a two hour time limit with pay and display for non-permit holders at all times. Change single yellow lines to double yellow lines
Longmarket	No waiting at any time
Marshwood Close	Double yellow lines throughout
Whitehall Bridge Road	Change single yellow lines to double yellow lines

Notice is hereby given that KENT COUNTY COUNCIL propose to make the above Order under sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3), 3(2), 4(1) and (2), 32(1), 35(1), 45, 46, 49 and 53 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act.

Fenoulet Way	Move a parking bay to accommodate redevelopment of a property
Swalecliffe Avenue	Make double yellow lines enforceable on the access road to the foreshore

Brewery Lane and Bridgeford Way	Bridge	Double yellow lines at the junction
Church Hill and Faulknors Lane	Harbledown & Rough Common	Double yellow lines
