

Notice is hereby given that KENT COUNTY COUNCIL propose to make these Orders under sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3), 3(2), 4(1) and (2), 32(1), 35(1), 45, 46, 49 and 53 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act.

THE KENT COUNTY COUNCIL (CANTERBURY) (TRAFFIC REGULATION AND STREET PARKING PLACES) (AMENDMENT NO 1) ORDER 2021

The effect of the Order is to amend the Kent County Council (Canterbury) (Traffic Regulation and Street Parking Places) (Consolidation) Order 2019 by introducing new or varying existing parking and waiting restrictions on the following lengths of road in Canterbury:

Edward Road and Albert Road	Change single yellow lines to double yellow lines to prevent damage to parked cars caused by turning traffic
Lime Kiln Road	Double yellow lines at the side of 31a Oxford Road
Manor Close	Double yellow lines at the junctions
St Lawrence Road	Remove the parking bay nearest to the junction with New Dover Road and create a new bay outside The Coach House
Starle Close	Change single yellow line to double yellow lines to protect garage access
Temple Road	Remove a parking bay near the junction with London Road

THE KENT COUNTY COUNCIL (HERNE BAY) (TRAFFIC REGULATION AND STREET PARKING PLACES) (AMENDMENT NO 1) ORDER 2021

The effect of the Order is to amend the Kent County Council (Herne Bay) (Traffic Regulation and Street Parking Places) (Consolidation) Order 2019 by introducing new or varying existing parking and waiting restrictions on the following lengths of road in Herne Bay:

Bogshole Lane and Bramley Gardens	Double yellow lines at the junction
Stanley Road and Kings Road	Double yellow lines at the junction
The Meadows and Plough Court	Double yellow lines at the junction

THE KENT COUNTY COUNCIL (CANTERBURY RURAL PARISHES) (TRAFFIC REGULATION AND STREET PARKING PLACES) (AMENDMENT NO 1) ORDER 2021

The effect of the Order is to amend the Kent County Council (Canterbury Rural Parishes) (Traffic Regulation and Street Parking Places) (Consolidation) Order 2019 by introducing new or varying existing parking and waiting restrictions on the following lengths of road in rural locations in the Canterbury district:

Church Lane	Petham	Double yellow lines outside the entrance to the Village Hall
Shalloak Road, Sweenchgate and Mayton Lane	Broad Oak	Double yellow lines at the junction

THE KENT COUNTY COUNCIL (WHITSTABLE) (TRAFFIC REGULATION AND STREET PARKING PLACES) (AMENDMENT NO 1) ORDER 2021

The effect of the Order is to amend the Kent County Council (Whitstable) (Traffic Regulation and Street Parking Places) (Consolidation) Order 2019 by introducing new or varying existing parking and waiting restrictions on the following lengths of road in Whitstable:

Belton Close	Move disabled parking bay
Emelina Way	Double yellow lines on the bends
Glebe Way	Double yellow lines opposite Foreland Cottages
Joy Lane and Florence Avenue	Extend double yellow lines at the junction
Lang Court	Double yellow lines
Marine Crescent and Princess Road	Double yellow lines at the junction
Meadow Walk and Spring Walk	Double yellow lines at the junction opposite No 7 Meadow Walk
Plough Lane	Double yellow lines by the emergency gate to the foreshore
Queens Road and St Anne's Road	Double yellow lines at the junction

THE KENT COUNTY COUNCIL (VARIOUS ROADS, CITY OF CANTERBURY) (PROHIBITION OF STOPPING ON FOOTWAY OR VERGE) (AMENDMENT NO 1) ORDER 2021

The effect of the Order is to amend the Kent County Council (Various Roads, City Of Canterbury) (Prohibition Of Stopping On Footway Or Verge) (Consolidation) Order 2019 by introducing new or varying existing parking and waiting restrictions on the following lengths of road in Canterbury:

Oaten Hill	On both sides for the entire length
