Notice is hereby given that the KENT COUNTY COUNCIL has made the above Order under sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3), 3(2), 4(1) and (2), 32(1), 35(1), 45, 46, 49 and 53 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act:

The effect of the Order is to amend the Kent County Council (Canterbury) (Traffic Regulation and Street Parking Places) (Consolidation) Order 2018 by introducing new or varying existing parking and waiting restrictions on the following lengths of road in Canterbury:

Becket Mews	Fill in the gap in the double yellow lines
Cadnam Close, Lyndhurst Close and Salisbury Road	Double yellow lines at the junctions and single yellow line in Cadnam Close
Cherry Garden Road	Double yellow lines at the junction with St Thomas Hill
City View	Pavement parking ban and single yellow lines
Glen Iris Avenue	Changes to the double yellow lines
Harkness Drive	Single yellow line between Whitstable Road and Roselands Gardens
Hever Place and Wichling Close	Double yellow lines and single yellow line
Homersham	Extend the double yellow lines at the Hollow Lane end to include the junction with Birch Road
Lady Wootton's Green and Church Street (St Paul's)	Replace the single yellow lines with double yellow lines.
Oaten Hill Place	Replace the single yellow line with double yellow lines.
Old Dover Road	Loading ban Monday to Friday, 8am to 6.30pm, between Nackington Road and New Dover Road
On street permit charges - C	Increase permit prices in line with inflation
Parham Close	Double yellow lines
St Michaels Road	Double yellow lines outside Nos 2 to 28
St Peters Place	Double yellow lines in the access road to Ivy Cottage
St Radigund's Street area	Additional residents' parking bays in Pound Lane, St Radigund's Street, St Peter's Lane, Knotts Lane, Abbots Place

Central Parade parking charges	Bring the charges for on-street pay & display parking into line with the off-street charges
Eddington Lane	Double yellow lines opposite entrance to MBS yard
Grand Drive and Throwley Drive	Double yellow lines at the junction
Mayfield Road	Double yellow lines on the north side between Douglas Road and Oakdale Road
On street permit charges - H	Increase permit prices in line with inflation
Peartree Road	Pavement parking ban and double yellow lines at junctions and car park accesses
Reculver Road and Reculver Drive	Double yellow lines outside Nos 183 to 189
Reculver Road near numbers 86 to 94	Single yellow line outside the Rising Sun and a two hour parking bay on the southern side
Sea Street and Fitzgerald Avenue	Double yellow lines
St Anne's Drive yellow lines	Extend double yellow lines opposite No 6
The Boulevard	Double yellow lines
Windmill Road and Windmill Close	Double yellow lines at the junction

The effect of the Order is to amend the Kent County Council (Whitstable) (Traffic Regulation and Street Parking Places) (Consolidation) Order 2018 by introducing new or varying existing parking and waiting restrictions on the following lengths of road in Whitstable:

Clare Road	Double yellow lines at the rear access road between Nos 102 & 104
Foxgrove Road	Extend double yellow lines at the Ham Shades Lane end
Hamilton Road	Extend double yellow lines outside the church
High Street	Allow blue badge parking in taxi rank during the day
Long Reach Close and Sherwood Drive	Double yellow lines at the junction
Olympia Way, Belon Drive and Pacific Close	Double yellow lines
On street permit charges - W	Increase permit prices in line with inflation
Queens Road	Extend double yellow lines at the Castle Road end

**THE KENT COUNTY COUNCIL (CANTERBURY RURAL PARISHES) (TRAFFIC REGULATION AND STREET PARKING PLACES) (AMENDMENT NO 1a) ORDER 2019**

Notice is hereby given that the KENT COUNTY COUNCIL has made the above Order under sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3), 3(2), 4(1) and (2), 32(1), 35(1), 45, 46, 49 and 53 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act:

The effect of the Order is to amend the Kent County Council (Canterbury Rural Parishes) (Traffic Regulation and Street Parking Places) (Consolidation) Order 2018 by introducing new or varying existing parking and waiting restrictions on the following lengths of road in rural locations in the Canterbury district:

Church Road and Elmleigh Road, Littlebourne	Double yellow lines at the junction
St Michaels Close, Rough Common, outside numbers 20 to 28	Double yellow lines outside Nos 20 to 28
The Shrubbery, Barham	Double yellow lines at the junction

The orders were made on 11th April 2019 and came into force on 12 April 2019. Full details are contained in the Orders which, together with a statement of the council's reasons for making the Orders and a copy of the orders amended by the Orders, may be examined at the Canterbury City Council offices, Military Road, Canterbury, CT1 1YW during normal office hours.

Any person wishing to question the validity of the Orders or any of the provisions contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the relevant enabling Act or that any requirement of any such enabling Act or of any regulations made thereunder have not been complied with may within six weeks from the date on which the Orders was made make application to the High Court for this purpose.
