Notice is hereby given that KENT COUNTY COUNCIL has made the above Order under sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3), 3(2), 4(1) and (2), 32(1), 35(1), 45, 46, 49 and 53 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act:

The effect of the Order is to amend the Kent County Council (Canterbury) (Traffic Regulation and Street Parking Places) (Consolidation) Order 2017 by introducing new or varying existing parking and waiting restrictions on the following lengths of road in Canterbury:

Various Roads	Increased charges for on-street parking
Barton Road	Double yellow lines and single yellow lines (9am to 10am and 2pm to 3pm)
Beverley Road, North Holmes Road, Queens Avenue and Westgate Hall Road	Electric vehicle charging bay
Bishops Way	Move the single yellow line to the northern side of the road
Broad Oak Road	Double yellow lines outside Nos 35 to 43
George Roche Road	Double yellow lines opposite the junction of George Roche Road and Keats Corner
Harcourt Drive and Clifton Gardens	Double yellow lines at the junction
Havelock Street	Make parking restrictions apply on Sunday
Headcorn Drive and Bawden Close	Double yellow lines on the bend at the top of the hill
Hollow Lane	Extend double yellow lines between Hollowmede and Homersham
Ivy Place	Double yellow lines
Norfolk Road	Extend double yellow lines
Old Ruttington Lane	More parking bays
Oxford Road	Double yellow lines across the dropped kerbs outside No 99
Pilgrims Way	Single yellow line (9am to 10am and 2pm to 3pm) outside Nos 64 to 72
Salisbury Road	Additional double yellow lines outside Nos 21 to 31 and new single yellow line outside Nos 38 to 72.
South Canterbury Road	Extend the parking bay outside No 37
Stodmarsh Road	Extend the double yellow lines up to the church
Sussex Avenue	Double yellow lines in the access road to the Neighbourhood Centre
The Paddock	Remove some of the yellow lines to create more parking space
Vauxhall Road	Extend double yellow lines on the southern side

Central Parade	Increased charges for on-street parking and electric vehicle charging bay

Reculver Road outside the Miramar	Double yellow lines at the side access to the Miramar care home
Spenser Road	Extend double yellow lines east of Canterbury Road
Western Avenue and Linden Avenue	Double yellow lines at the junction
Wye Green and Old Thanet Way	Double yellow lines at the junction

Beach Walk	Increased charges for on-street parking
Borstal Hill and Cages Close	Double yellow lines at the junction
Cromwell Road, Gladstone Road, Nelson Road and Sea Street	Electric vehicle charging bay
Edgar Close	Double yellow lines
Ham Shades Lane and Foxgrove Road	Double yellow lines at the junction
Nursery Close	Double yellow lines at the road junction outside No 30

**THE KENT COUNTY COUNCIL (CANTERBURY RURAL PARISHES) (TRAFFIC REGULATION AND STREET PARKING PLACES) (AMENDMENT NO 1a) ORDER 2018**

Notice is hereby given that KENT COUNTY COUNCIL has made the above Order under sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3), 3(2), 4(1) and (2), 32(1), 35(1), 45, 46, 49 and 53 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act:

The effect of the Order is to amend the Kent County Council (Canterbury Rural Parishes) (Traffic Regulation and Street Parking Places) (Consolidation) Order 2017 by introducing new or varying existing parking and waiting restrictions on the following lengths of road in rural locations in the Canterbury district:

Brooklands Close	Fordwich	Double yellow lines
High Street	Bridge	Double yellow lines between No 34 and Alexandra House
Island Road and East View	Hersden	Double yellow lines at the junction
Link Road	Hackington	Extend double yellow lines up to Tyler Hill Road
Western Avenue	Bridge	No parking except for mobile library in the parking area outside Nos 16 to 26

The orders were made on 19 April 2018 and come into force on 20 April 2018. Full details are contained in the Orders which, together with a statement of the council's reasons for making the Orders and a copy of the orders amended by the Orders, may be examined at the Canterbury City Council offices, Military Road, Canterbury, CT1 1YW during normal office hours.

Any person wishing to question the validity of the Orders or any of the provisions contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the relevant enabling Act or that any requirement of any such enabling Act or of any regulations made thereunder have not been complied with may within six weeks from the date on which the Orders was made make application to the High Court for this purpose.
