Public Bathing byelaws

Notice is hereby given that Canterbury City Council intends to make new byelaws under section 231 of the Public Health Act 1936, with respect to public bathing. The byelaws allot for public bathing the area of the sea to a distance seaward of 300 metres from high water mark, between the western boundary of the Canterbury district, being a point 590 metres to the west of the Sportsman Inn, and the eastern boundary of the Canterbury district, being a point 1,720 metres to the east of Reculver Towers, with the exception of areas referred to in the Seaside Pleasure Boats byelaws made by the Council under section 76 of the Public Health Act 1961.

Normal procedure requires copies of the proposed byelaws along with the certain appropriate documents to be kept at the offices of the Council and be open to inspection without payment on any weekday during usual business hours for 28 days from the publication of this notice.

Due to the present National lockdown measures in relation to Covid 19, it would be irresponsible for the Council to permit such inspections. Therefore, the documents will be available free of charge and upon request by telephone or email for 32 days from the publication of this notice.
