#### **Statement of Common Ground**

## **Canterbury City Council and Thanet District Council**

#### 1. Overview

- 1.1 This Statement of Common Ground (SOCG) reflects the agreed position between the parties.
- 1.2 The purpose of this SOCG is to set out the areas of agreement on key strategic matters and the basis on which the parties will continue to work together to meet the requirements of the Duty to Cooperate.
- 1.3 The geographical relationship between the parties, reflecting local authority boundaries, is represented at Figure 1.

# 2.0 Key strategic matters

- 2.1 The NPPF defines the topics considered to be strategic matters. The strategic matters relevant to CCC and TDC are:
  - Housing housing market area, meeting housing needs;
  - **Economy** economic market area, meeting employment needs;
  - Infrastructure transport, education; and
  - Environment habitats regulations issues.

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#### Housing

The Canterbury SHMA identifies an HMA centred on Canterbury.

The Thanet SHMA identifies a housing market area including parts of Dover and Canterbury.

The most recently published housing figure for TDC currently stands at 1085 new homes a year (21,700 over the plan period to 2040). TDC is intending to meet its needs in full within its area.

CCC is in the process of reviewing its housing requirement. The Local Housing Need figure is currently 1,120dpa. CCC is intending to meet its needs in full within its area.

It is **agreed** that each party will seek to meet its own housing needs.

### **Economy**

The FEMA for Canterbury has been identified as including a small area of Thanet. The FEMA for Thanet has been identified as including some areas of Canterbury district.

TDC has commissioned work to inform the level of employment that should be planned for through its Local Plan update and it is the Council's intention to identify sufficient land to fully meet that level of employment within Thanet district.

CCC is intending to meet its employment needs in full within its area.

It is **agreed** that each party will meet its own employment needs.

### Infrastructure

The parties **agree** that strategic transport issues include the A28 corridor which is the key south-west / north-east strategic link for East Kent, connecting Ashford, Canterbury and Thanet. Parts of this corridor are already at capacity and will require upgrades to support growth and economic development.

The parties **agree** that strategic education issues relate to the provision of secondary school education capacity in the Canterbury coastal area.

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### **Environment**

The parties **agree** that recreational impacts could have an adverse impact on the species for which the Thanet Coast SPA has been designated.

Natural England has raised water quality concerns in relation to the Stodmarsh European Site. The parties are working together to understand the geography of this issue and whether it could be a key strategic matter for subsequent SoCG.
